| World Wide Web (WWW) | A myriad of computers connected via the internet able to communicate both with each other and your computer using defined protocols and security measures. |
| Internet Service Provider (ISP) Virgin, Talk Talk, Plus Net, BT | Connects your computer to the WWW via a Broadband or dial up connection |
| Operating System Microsoft Windows, Google Android, Apple OS X, Linux | Enables your computer hardware to run applications (programs) and connect to an ISP |
| Web Browser Google Chrome, Internet Explorer, Edge, Firefox | An application loaded in the Operating System which enables you to browse the web and interact with selected websites |
| WebSite google.com, amazon.co.uk, marksandspencer.com | A collection of data and functions stored within one of the myriad of computers with which you can interact |

| Information Wikipedia, Weather | Text and photos |
| Shopping Ebay, Amazon | Enables viewing of lists of items to purchase at a price. Enables connection to your bank for verification of the purchase |
| Email Gmail, Thunderbird, Outlook | An application either accessed directly through your Browser or via an application loaded in your Operating system enabling sending, receiving and storing emails. Many email clients can connect to more than one email address on more than one server |
| Video YouTube, BBC iPlayer, Vimeo | Provides streaming video |
| Cloud Storage Dropbox, Google Drive | Provides space to store your files and enables replication of these files with storage in your hard drive or solid state drive |
| Search Engine Google, Bing, Yahoo | Trawls the entire world wide web to find occurrences of your search words and list websites which contain them |
